



# Walk the Santiago to Finisterre Way

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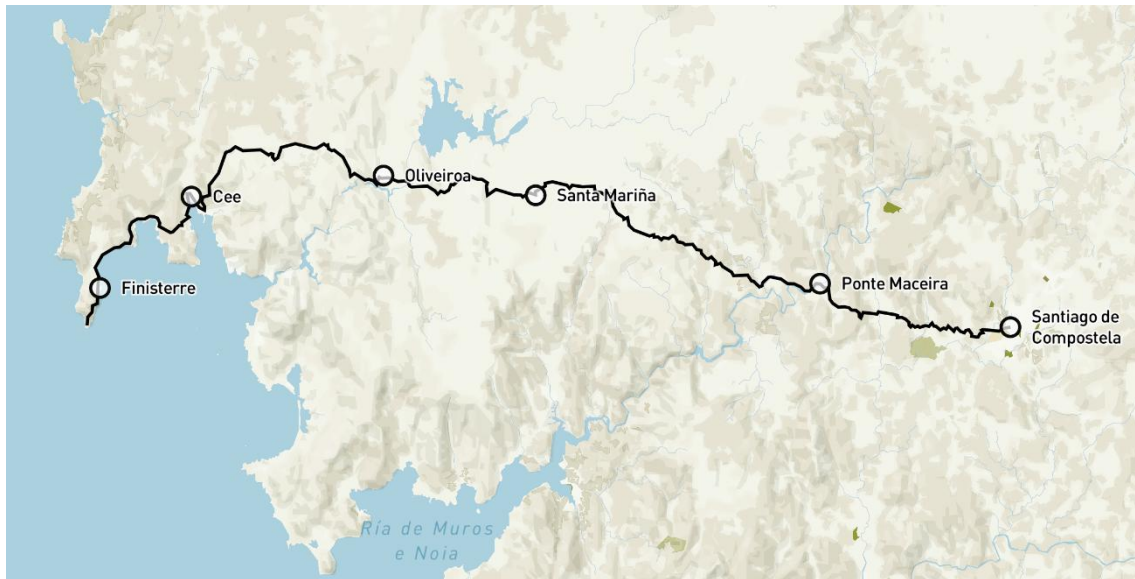
## *The end of the Earth*

Known as the Costa da Morte (Coast of Death), this part of northern Spain was the furthest known land until explorers set sail in the Middle Ages. In pre-Roman times, people believed this was the place where souls rose to heaven, a notion understandable when witnessing the sun slip into the vast ocean.

The Camino de Santiago to Finisterre extends the Way of St James from Santiago de Compostela to the 'end of the Earth', a mystical and symbolic place to complete your journey. This Camino, although ancient, is far less travelled than those that end in Santiago, leaving you to fully appreciate the tranquil beauty of this unspoilt part of Galicia with few distractions.



## Day-by-day itinerary



### Day 1: Arrival to Santiago de Compostela

Arrive in Santiago de Compostela and take some time to explore this atmospheric old city. When you check into your hotel, you will receive your Welcome Kit, which contains all the information you need to fully enjoy this self-guided walking holiday.

**Accommodation:** 3-star hotel

### Day 2: Walk from Santiago de Compostela to Ponte Maceira (17km / 10.5 miles)

As you leave Santiago, make a point of looking back at the city for memorable views. The rest of today's walk takes you through leafy woodland and green fields broken up with intermittent villages. Cross a Roman bridge and end the stage in the pleasant town of Ponte Maceira.

**Accommodation:** 3-star Country hotel | **Meals:** Breakfast

### Day 3: Walk from Ponte Maceira to Santa Mariña (24km / 15 miles)

You'll need an early start and a good breakfast to help you manage the long, gradual climb out of Negreira. Once you reach the ridge, you can enjoy the pretty forest paths, peaceful rural roads and attractive scenery all the way to the village of Santa Mariña.

**Accommodation:** 3-star Country hotel | **Meals:** Breakfast

### Day 4: Walk from Santa Mariña to Olveiroa (13km / 8.1 miles)

This stage is relatively short, allowing you to have a late start and recover from the previous day. Follow country lanes and enjoy the scenery as you climb to Monte Aro before your final descent into the village of Olveiroa.

**Accommodation:** 2-star hotel | **Meals:** Breakfast

### Day 5: Walk from Olveiroa to Cee (20km / 12.5 miles)

Today's walk is far less hilly and quite scenic, taking you between mountains, windmills and forests for your first sighting of the Atlantic Ocean and Cape Finisterre. Make your way slowly down the steep hill to the charming village of Cee with its small sandy cove and colourful fishing boats.

**Accommodation:** 3-star hotel | **Meals:** Breakfast

### **Day 6: Walk from Cee to Finisterre (16km / 10 miles)**

The day begins with a climb through Concorbión, after which you'll head back down to the beach. From here, the Way more or less follows the coastline and the extensive Langosteira beach towards Finisterre, offering beguiling views of the cape. The 'end of the world' is further 3 km from the fishing village and marked with a lighthouse.

**Accommodation:** 2/3-star hotel | **Meals:** Breakfast

### **Day 7: Departure**

After breakfast, prepare for your onward journey.

### INCLUDED:

- 6 Nights of accommodation with breakfast included;

**Accommodations:** A combination of 2-star and 3-star hotels, restored manor houses, and small inns located on the Camino. All rooms have their own bathrooms. We've chosen these accommodations for their hospitality, comfort, and location. Keep in mind that as you walk through the rural countryside, 3-star hotels are not always available at every stop.

**Meals:** All breakfasts are included with your accommodation. We have arranged for you to be provided with more than the standard Spanish breakfast of coffee and toast. Please let us know if you have any dietary restrictions, and we can ask our hotels to accommodate them as well.

**Luggage transport:** We will arrange for the transfer of one suitcase or piece of luggage (15 kg) per person between your hotels during your walk along the Camino. If you require more than one bag, please contact us for details.

**Pre- / During / Post-Trip Service:** We're here to help! Based in Northern Portugal, we are here to ensure that your trip runs as smoothly as possible. Please don't hesitate to contact our support line to ask for our assistance.
